THE FALCONER CHILDREN'S HOME

For many years our Church has supported the Falconer Children's Home and orphanage in Kabulamena, a small village in Zambia, by sending practical gifts and money to the Falconer Trust. The home was founded by a remarkable woman, Lilias Falconer, in 1947 and in the 50 years up to her death in 1998, she saved over 600 babies. No child was ever refused admission and the welcome sign in front of the Home still says," Who so shall receive one such little child in My name, receives me."

Donations will be gratefully received during the Nativity Gift Service on Sunday 15th December, but you can bring your gifts to Church any time up to the end of January. There is also a retiring collection for the Falconer Trust at this service.

The items most needed are as follows:

Food for babies: baby milk powder (all ages from birth); rusks, baby food(tins please, *not jars*), powdered baby food eg Milupa, Aptamil/Cow and Gate

Food for children: powdered milk, porridge, Weetabix, tinned meat and fish, baked beans (*preferably with a ring-pull top*), powdered soup, pasta and rice

Clothing for all ages, *but no heavy coats*, knitted hats, scarves, gloves, knitted/crocheted blankets, fabric for making clothes

Toiletries: soap, toothbrushes and toothpaste, baby bath, baby shampoo, nappies (Terry or disposable)

Stationery: pens, pencils, crayons (preferably not felt tips), paper, notebooks, rulers, pencil sharpeners etc.

We do hope we can send a bumper collection to the Falconer Trust and thank you all for your support.
